


## San Juan County's new Online Permit Portal

## **Making a Permit Payment Online**


Contact the Department of Community Development (DCD) for a Portal Access Code (PAC) at <a href="mailto:dcdpermits@sanjuanco.com">dcdpermits@sanjuanco.com</a>. Then Sign up for a portal account here:




Then select the permit you intend to pay for and the next screen will populate. Select "Pay Online"





This will take you to the payment portal where you will need to add the fee to your cart by clicking on the plus symbol to add the payment to your cart.



The fee amount shown is \$18 and there is a \$2.00 transaction fee assessed to total the \$20.00 Burn Permit fee. Once the fee is paid, you will be able to print and sign your permit, which must be kept onsite during any burn you conduct throughout the season.

(Note that there is a credit card convenience charge of 2.5% assessed on purchases over \$80.00. The credit card charge for a transaction of \$80.00 or less is \$2.00.)

Be safe and remember, you must have a shovel and a charged hose onsite. Burn piles can be no larger



than 10' in diameter and 6' high. In the absence of a hose, you must have two five gallon buckets full of water and a shovel AND the burn pile can be no larger than 5' in diameter and 5' high.

The purpose of a residential burn is for tree trimmings and blow-down debris. Absolutely no garbage or hazardous waste materials can be burned.
