SJCC 8.06.140 Certificate of Water Availability - Building Permits

A. Applicants for building permits for construction of new structures that contain plumbing fixtures dependent on potable water for their operation must obtain a Certificate of Water Availability (CWA). Applications for "After the Fact" building permits shall be treated as a "new structure" for the purpose of requiring a CWA.

- B. Applicants for a building permit to remodel or expand an existing structure shall obtain a Certificate of Water Availability (CWA) when any of the following conditions exist:
 - 1. When the remodel/addition results in a change of use from a residence to a commercial structure or conversion of an accessory structure to a residential use.
 - 2. When the remodel/addition results in the creation of an accessory dwelling unit

Documentation requirements:

If there is not an approved Certificate of Water Availability (CWA) from within the last 12 months on file at the time of building permit submittal, the applicant should initiate the CWA review process by submitting the application to Health & Community Services and ask for a 'received' stamped copy of the CWA application so that the applicant may submit with the building permit application. The building permit application should be considered incomplete if a receipted CWA application is not submitted for permit applications that require a CWA.
